Dear Members,

Spring is upon us and with it comes great anticipation of the Golf Course Improvement Project which is scheduled to begin on April 19.

Every effort has been made to minimize disruption to play and to ensure your enjoyment of the club while these improvements are being made. Important information will be forthcoming so please keep an eye out for the Clubber, the Weekly Happenings, and special emails from Tim Cloninger and Rich Spurlin, to stay up to date on the project. As you know, a Steering Committee has been created to provide additional oversight and communication with members so you are likely to hearing from them, as well.

It has been a very busy and very productive few months since the Golf Course Improvement Project was approved by the membership. Much time has been devoted to finalizing contracts and securing financing for the project. Many thanks to the Board of Directors, Finance and Green Committee members, and Club Management for their extra time and efforts.

The ECC Board of Directors and Club Management continue to be conservative with financial projections - particularly with regard to membership, cash balances, and debt. At the same time, members continue to have strong opinions about membership priorities and the important dynamic of debt.

To this end, I couldn't be more pleased to share that in securing financing for the Golf Course Improvement Project, ECC was presented with the opportunity to refinance our current long-term Clubhouse Renovation debt with the same favorable (low) interest rate as the Golf Course Improvement Project short-term loan. With this restructured financing, we are fortunate to have eliminated a balloon payment in 2033, paying down our long-term debt proportionally and fully over 15 years.

A look back at the most recent member survey indicates that we're on the right path!

DRC Research 2018 | Eugene Country Club Membership Survey Summary

CLUB PRIORITIES

When members were asked "Which of the following do you think is most important?" Making Club Improvements, Reducing the Club's debt, or both – 17% said Club improvements, 17% said Reduce debt, and 66% said both are important.

Following the general question of importance members were asked to rank a list of potential Club improvements - Golf Course Maintenance Improvements ranked first (47% selected it #1) followed by Reduce Club's Debt and very closely third Driving Range and Practice Facility Improvements.

The Finance Committee has already begun work on a 20-year long-term financial plan (with 5 years of historical reference) to support the prioritization, planning, and funding of future capital improvements because we are always striving to evolve and improve.

We appreciate your cooperation and your assistance by communicating the dress code to your guests. Thank you!

Ladies – are you ready to dust off the golf clubs and get back to playing?!? Please contact the Golf Shop to RSVP for the Women's Pre-Season Golf Clinics. Due to covid cautions we will make the group size small and the lessons just be an hour in length. The dates will be Tuesday & Wednesday, April 13 & 14 along with Tuesday & Wednesday, April 20 & 21.

The Golf Shop is starting to fill-up with the latest and greatest offerings from Callaway, Taylor Made and Titleist. If you have not updated your driver in the last 4 years, you may be missing an opportunity to hit the ball farther and straighter. Likewise, if you have played more than 75 rounds with your wedges, studies have shown that your grooves are probably starting to lose their ability to grip the ball and give you spin. Please let the Golf Professional staff know if you would like to demo some new wedges.

Spring is also a great time to have your clubs regripped. The Pro Shop offers regrip services – most of the time this can be done in 24 hours or less. Depending upon how much golf you play, your grips should be replaced annually. You would be amazed how much better your clubs will feel with a fresh set of grips.

Please help to maintain the great playing conditions on the golf course by fixing your ball marks, replacing your divots, and driving your golf cart no closer than 30 feet. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Like many of you, I enjoy a little bit of music while I play golf these days. It is important, however, that we are courteous to our fellow members who might enjoy the peace and quiet of the golf course. If you choose to play music, please do so at a volume that only you and your cart partner can hear. Thank you again!

As I am writing this article we are setting everything up for our greens and fairway aerification the week of March 29. The weather forecast for aerification week looks dry so we should be able to get a great aerification on the greens and fairways. The greens need a good aerification after a winter season of record play at ECC. The greens have held up well to the extra traffic but traffic causes soil compaction and less than optimal conditions for drainage and root growth.

The greens will be core aerified with a ½ inch hollow tine then sand topdressed. Aerification recovery in the spring can take longer than the fall because of cooler soil temperatures. I would expect a full two weeks for complete recovery of the greens aerification. After aerification the greens are prone to large ball marks so please repair your ball marks.

The fairway aerification will start the week of March 29 but might need a few extra days to complete the week of April 5. The fairway aerification process is very similar to the greens as we pull a core, then sweep up the cores, then sand topdress the surface. We have a very efficient process in place but covering 30 acres of fairways takes some time.

The fairway aerification the past two seasons has improved the drainage and the firmness of the fairways significantly. However, we still need to continue the fairway aerification process and regular sand topdressing program to get the fairways where they can be fast and firm and healthy.

The replacement of our irrigation system this summer is much needed. We just recently pressurized the irrigation system and we are finding leaking sprinklers all over the course. We have had electrical components fail on 4 irrigation controllers already. The old system has to just make it one more season!

The refurbishment of the bunkers on number 9 green will start the week of April 19. The greenside bunkers on 9 will sit in the same location as the current bunkers are

now. During this work we will have a temporary green for number 9. After 9 bunkers we will move into re-grassing number 10 tee and also re-grassing and enlarging the East Putting Green. During this time we will have a temporary blue/white tee for number 10. As we finish up 10 tee and east putting green we will move into work on 18 greenside bunkers. During the work on 18 greenside we will have a temporary green for 18. During this process we will only have one temporary green being utilized.
