








Green Superintendent Brian Koffler

Beginning in March and continuing through October, one of our daily tasks is changing hole locations. We perform this task

Tuesday-Sunday, taking a day off each week for "Maintenance Monday." For November through February, we change hole locations based on the volume of play each day. For several years, we have been utilizing a program called EZ Locator to assist in selecting legitimate hole locations. To demonstrate the hole locations available at certain green speeds, see the two images showing #13 green at a stimpmeter reading of 10' on the top and 12' on the bottom. I have selected those two speeds as those would be typical in the middle of winter vs. the middle of summer. Any black dot is considered reasonable, and any dot in white is considered off-limits. While I chose #13 as a demonstration that eliminates several hole locations with increased green speeds, you can imagine this issue is prevalent on any green with severe internal contouring. From an agronomic standpoint, the advantage of spreading the hole locations as much as possible is that it spreads foot traffic, reducing soil compaction in heavily trafficked areas.
